#### **INTERNATIONAL SCIENCE, ENGINEERING,** AND LEADERSHIP CAMP

The Ripon Area School District, in collaboration with Ripon College will host a two-week engineering and science camp for interested students entering grades 9-12 from July 16-July 27. Camp participants, will explore many types of engineering fields and see how they can lead to great careers while interacting with students from another country. Students will have the opportunity to work with Ripon High School and Ripon College Staff to explore chemical engineering and science in the natural world during the day. They may also choose to participate in optional leadership activities with their high school peers and our international guests during the evening at no cost. This entire camp, offered as an extension to summer school, is free of charge to RASD students. Additionally, RHS students will have the opportunity to earn a 0.5 science credit toward their graduation requirements.

#### **INCUMBENTS RE-ELECTED TO RIPON SCHOOL BOARD**

Incumbents Andy Lyke, Nicole Kutz-Menard, and John Sperger were re-elected to the Ripon Board of Education for three-year terms in the April 3 election. Andy Lyke received 1,404 votes, John Sperger received 1,108 votes, and Nicole Kutz-Menard received 1,107 votes. In accordance with state statute, the Board will hold its annual reorganization meeting on April 23, at which time officers for the 2018-19 year will be elected. Current officers include David Scott as president, Gary Rodman as vice president, John Sperger as clerk, and Amy Pollesch as treasurer. Board policy contains a term limit provision that prohibits anyone from serving in the same office for more than two consecutive years. Mr. Scott is completing his second year as Board President. The remaining officers are completing their first year in their current roles.

These tests together create the Wisconsin Student Assessment System (WSAS). WSAS is a comprehensive statewide program designed to provide information about what students know in core academic areas and whether Much like the four seasons in Wisconsin predict the changing weather patterns, the testing season is a prediction of student mastery of academic standards. Just as each season in Wisconsin provides opportunity for change, testing season provides an opportunity to reflect on the academic growth and achievement of our students. Test results will help prepare educators and students for a new academic year. We are sensitive to the fact that much like the weather during each changing season, the results acquired during testing season are not the only measure of student success. For this reason, we are committed to creating a balanced education system that uses multiple measures to gauge student success. ### **RIPON RECEIVES NATIONAL RECOGNITION FOR COMMITMENT** TO EMPOWERING STUDENTS

The Ripon Area School District has been recognized as a Project Lead The Way (PLTW) Distinguished District for having had 20 percent or more of its students in each grade, K-12, participate in a PLTW program during the 2016-17 school year. It is one of just over 30 districts across the U.S. to receive this honor and one of only five districts in Wisconsin.

The PLTW Distinguished District recognition honors districts committed to increasing student access, engagement, and achievement in engineering, computer science and biomedical programs. Ripon is unique in that PLTW is offered to all students in grade K-8 through the Launch and Gateway programs. At the high school level, all sophomores are required to take the Principles of Engineering course and have the option to take a PLTW Engineering Pathway and/or Computer Science Pathway which offer additional PLTW courses to them over their high school career.

The program is possible through the support of the School Board, Curriculum Director Chrissy Damm, our principals, Technology Department and our staff. Ripon has been fortunate to have significant community partners such as Alliance Laundry and Ripon Printers helping to build the program through donations and programming support. "The partnership is paying off. We are very excited about our collaboration with area businesses and know their help has been a great asset in getting us to this point in our journey to build the workforce in our area," said Superintendent Dr. Mary Whitrock.
