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Ripon Area School District Receives Safer Communities/Stronger Connections Grant

RIPON, Wis. — Ripon Area School District has been chosen to receive \$285,787 through the DPI

Bipartisan Safer Communities Act (BSCA) Stronger Connections Grant which is intended to provide

funding for high-need local educational agencies (LEAs) to support safe and healthy students. Budget

items must align to establish safe, healthy, and supportive learning opportunities and environments for

students. Ripon's plan included funding for the purchase of and training in eduCLIMBER, Responsive

Classroom, and Developmental Designs.

eduCLIMBER is a data management software for intervention tracking, collaboration,

effectiveness reporting, early warning, and driving system-level improvement. By utilizing this software,

the District is positioned to bolster student achievement and well-being by evaluating and monitoring

the effectiveness of extra instruction provided to students who may be struggling academically or with

behavior.

Responsive Classroom is a four-day training program designed to help 4K-5th grade teachers

create safe, joyful, and engaging classrooms and school communities for both students and teachers.

Staff will dig into four key domains: engaging academics, positive community, effective management,

and deeply responsive teaching. Throughout this training, professional staff will learn to help students

develop strong social, emotional, and academic skills.

Developmental Designs is a four-day training program designed to help middle and high school

teachers build a supportive community that assists students in academic achievement, responsible

independence, and lifelong pro-social habits. The core components of the program include incorporating

relationship-building, social skill-building, safe community, cultural responsiveness, and intrinsic

motivation all across the school, throughout the day.
