2016 Friend of Public Schools



Todd Kaul, Alliance Laundry Systems Plant Manager and Anna Ewerdt, Plant Human Resources Manager attended the District Staff Inservice on August 24 to receive the 2016 Friend of Public Schools Award. Alliance Laundry Systems is a true friend of public education. Over the past two years, the Ripon Area School District and Alliance Laundry Systems formed an official partnership to strengthen technical education and the Ripon community as a whole. The Ripon Area School District has a history of partnerships with business and organizations within the community and Alliance Laundry Systems has been one of those partners. Alliance Laundry was founded in Ripon in 1908, and the company has been a strong pillar of the community since that time.

Alliance Laundry Systems, the Ripon community's largest employer, is a provider of commercial laundry systems. The company designs, manufactures, and markets a line of commercial laundry equipment in over 100 countries including the Czech Republic and China. Alliance Laundry's core values include leadership, reliability and excellence. As a result, they support educating students on manufacturing and enlightening them to the career opportunities available.

Beginning in the fall of 2014, Alliance began working with Ripon High School students through a technical education apprenticeship program. Students in the apprenticeship program earn credit and receive a paycheck while learning on the job. In the spring of 2015, Alliance Laundry supported the District through the plan and design phase of the new technical education space within RASD's combined middle and high school. This work included facilitating a Kaisen process to bring administrators, teachers, students, local business leaders, and staff from Moraine Park Technical College together over the course of several months. During that time, the Kaisen team reviewed the program course offering, curriculum, resources, equipment and the actual physical space in the new combined MS and HS building.

Most recently, Alliance Laundry Systems committed to further strengthening their partnership with the Ripon Area School District. Alliance Laundry Systems pledged Ripon Area School District a maximum of \$100,000 over the next two years to be received in quarterly installments. This money will go towards supporting Technology Education Fabrication computers and software in addition to scoreboards for the new gym. Furthermore, they have also offered to support the Technology Education laboratory with material, tools, parts, guidance and other areas where their involvement can enhance the department outside of their monetary contribution.

The Ripon Area Public Schools are fortunate to have friends such as Alliance Laundry Systems. This partnership between the Ripon Area School District and Alliance Laundry will help to provide Ripon students and residents with motivating and stimulating career paths. Alliance recognized a need in their manufacturing sector of the labor market and worked to develop opportunities and provide the resources needed for the Ripon Area School District to be positioned to help individuals improve themselves and ultimately gain employment which strengthens the Ripon community.

Our technology team has been working hard on moving teachers into their new classrooms in the high school and middle school, as well as getting devices ready for teachers and students as they come back for the new year. We have a gigantic implementation in our new Learning Management System, Canvas, so a significant amount of work has been done to ensure that the rollout goes as smoothly as possible. Teachers

will be learning to use Canvas right along with students!

ACT Scores Remain High

The Ripon graduating class of 2016 maintained scores consistent with the state average. This is the first time all juniors in the school district were required to take the assessment. This assessment was administered to students during the spring of their junior year, 2015. A total of 123 students were tested and Ripon students outperformed the state average in English and mathematics. Our students scored just under the state average in reading and science. Ripon's composite score of 20.4 was just under the state score of 20.5.
