- b. BP, BPC, and JCS combined handbook

VIII. Teacher's Report

a. Emergency Remote Learning: 144/154 students or 94% regularly attended teacher meets and completed assigned tasks

Of the 10 students not attending-1 was hospitalized for the entire time; 1 met solely with special education teacher, 2 met solely with EL teacher, 1 was active the last few weeks once connectivity issues were resolved, 2 were active for the first three weeks, 1 family with a student with special education needs was overwhelmed, 1 minor participation, 1 no participation.

b. Education Foundation Grant

Carrie received her Scoopin' the Loop (and More) with Kindness grant. Andrew Prellwitz had reached out and asked if Carrie wanted to revise the grant due to Emergency Remote Learning. After revising, Carrie was notified that she received the grant. The grant would finalize our multi-age Kindness focus. Here is a summary of the revised grant:

To wrap up "Our Kindness Journey" for the 2019-2020 school year, we would love to have our families take our students into the Ripon community and hand out flowers and hand-decorated hearts to unsuspecting recipients and/or deliver flowers and hearts to neighbor's doorsteps. In addition, we would deliver flowers and hearts to all the Assisted Living Facilities within Ripon and ask the directors to pass them out to all the tenants, residents and staff.

If we received this grant, we would coordinate dates and times for Journey families to pick up the flowers and hearts and ask them to share their delivery plan with us. This ensures that we are able to spread our kindness throughout the entire city.

BUDGET:

• 1,000 carnations from <u>www.wholeblossoms.com</u> = \$449.99 (This gives each Journey Charter School student and staff 6 carnations to hand out as intentional acts of kindness.)

- c. Staff Retreat Plan

Staff will be meeting virtually on July 7, 14, and 21 to plan our Health and Wellness multi-age focus for the 2020-2021 school year.

Responsive Classroom Training with Jackie Adams

Historically staff are paid for two retreat work days @ \$100.00/day. We would again request this payment for two work days. This year, due to COVID-19, we will not be traveling so there is significant cost savings as retreat costs are usually around \$3,100.00.

Estimated costs will be:

6 staff X \$100.00/day X 2 days = \$1,200.00 (all staff may not attend the Responsive Classroom training so costs may be reduced)

1 staff X \$100.00/day X 1 day = \$100.00 (Jackie Adams)

1 staff X \$200.00/day X 1 day = \$200.00 (Jackie Adams as Responsive Classroom trainer)

Total: \$1,500.00

AFGRE Grant-we will be notified in August

If we do not receive the AFGRE grant, Carrie would like to propose using dollars to realize the proposal of existing flower bed update and/or creation of a butterfly garden. Barb Morrison's quote for all work was \$7, 937.25.

Shelby will be starting the Advanced Manners class next Monday-the class runs for 6 weeks and will be another step toward her readiness for therapy training. The class is \$155.00.
