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## Grade Level Requirements

The following are specific grade level descriptions and requirements. For parents, this outlines the expectations of time commitment and curricular areas for each grade level. The student's advisory teacher will use this guide when developing the student's Individualized Learning Plan. This learning plan will guide the student's personalized learning for the school year.

## Grades 7 and 8

Grade 7-8 students: Students in grades 7-12 can take their common core courses through three different options of learning: PBL Courses through Odyssey, Hybrid courses and online courses.In addition, an appropriate Project-Based Learning plan will be created to collect evidence and show competency. All students are required to work on common core subjects each day. (See below for daily time requirements.)

The following courses will provide you with a general overview of what will be offered. Courses are subject to change based upon availability and enrollment.

## Grades 9-12

The Ripon Area School District requires students to obtain 24 credits in specific areas to graduate (see chart below) The following courses will provide you with a general overview of what will be offered. Courses are subject to vary slightly based upon availability and need.
Through the ILP process, advisory teachers will work with the students to select the course options that will meet all of the graduation requirements, as well as ensure course selections follow their chosen career path and post high school plans.

## Individualized Learning Plans

Odyssey Academy teachers work with a group of students in a specific grade level or subject area(s) utilizing Individualized Learning Plans (ILPs) that support the needs of the student. The first step to developing a student's Individualized Learning Plan occurs when parents work with teachers to understand the courses their child is required to take. Once the required courses are identified, an Odyssey Academy teacher will work with students and parents to select appropriate resources (from Odyssey Approved Curriculum list) to personalize and enhance the course. Students will select project-based learning projects to complete each quarter in science and social students. In addition, students have options for additional support in a variety of course subjects and can participate in additional guided study groups.

## Learning Resources

Odyssey Academy uses its funds for learning resources that help students meet content area standards.

- All materials and resource requests must match the course outlined in the students individualized learning plan and meet aspects of content standards. All requests are pending the approval of the subject teacher and the Odyssey Academy office.

## Service Learning

We encourage students to become contributors to their communities. One way to do that is through service learning. Students and families may choose to build volunteer time or service components into their projects. These activities may be recorded as part of the time spent on the project work.

## Project-Based Learning

If you want to use paper curriculum or digital course materials of choice, you may design projects that meet academic standards. We use a Learning Management System for tracking the student projects that you design and teachers approve. Each student will be set up with an account. Students should consult their account each school day to review work to be completed, deadlines to be met and view messages from teachers. You have many options and choices for structuring learning in this system.

## - EARNING GRADES IN PROJECT BASED LEARNING

- For students 7-12, their grades will be awarded on a POINT system, where students will need to earn enough points during the course of the semester on a 100 point scale. $(60 \%=D, 70 \%=C$, $80 \%=\mathrm{B}, 90 \%=\mathrm{A}$ ). For example, some projects which are smaller (i.e. a book report) may earn up to 10 points. Some project may be larger and earn up to 50 points. Each project should be geared towards reaching as many State Standards as possible. We use the LMS to keep track and organize these projects to their standards.


## ELA

Grade 7-8 students may select reading and writing curricula that provides them with daily reading and writing lessons and practice. These lessons may be integrated with science and/or social studies. Students should spend a minimum of 60 minutes a day reading and 45 minutes each day on writing.

Grade 9-12 students may select reading and writing curricula that provides them with four or more high school credits of English.

## Science and Social Studies

Grade 7-8 students may select curricula that provides them with daily lessons and practice in both subjects. These lessons may be integrated with other subject areas. Students should spend a minimum of 60 minutes working each day.

Grade 9-12 students need to have 3 high school credits of both Science and Social Studies. However, for Social Studies, students will also need to meet the following requirements: US History 1.0 credits and Government 0.5 credits. Students (class of 2020 or later) will need 0.5 credits of Financial Literacy. Students will also need to pass the State's Civics exam with a score that is at or higher than 65 out of 100 questions.

## Mathematics

Grade 7-8 students may select curricula that provides them with daily lessons and practice in both subjects. These lessons may be integrated with other subject areas. Students should spend a minimum of 60 minutes working each day.

Grade 9-12 students need to have 3 or more high school credits. Depending upon what the student would like to pursue after high school will determine what courses the student should take.

## Physical Education and Health

Grade 7-8 students need to have physical activity. Odyssey does so through a Project Based Learning system. Students in grades 7-8 will complete activity logs as well as some other activities and submit these to their teacher.

Grade $9-12$ students need to have 0.5 credits in Health and 1.5 credits of Physical Education in order to graduate.

## Financial Literacy \& Vocational Art

Grade 9-12 students will be required to take 0.5 credits of Financial Literacy and 0.5 credits of a Vocational Arts course for graduation.

## Electives

Students who live in proximity to Ripon Middle School or Ripon High School may take up to two courses per semester on site at Ripon schools. Parents are responsible for transportation.

Grade 7-8 students may select an elective curricula that provides them with daily lessons and practice for the second semester with the exception of a foreign language. Students should spend a minimum of 60 minutes each day. Music lessons and other lessons can be paid for through discretionary funds per student during the second semester and these fees would be paid directly to the provider.

Grade 9-12 students need to select 8.0 credits or more of elective curricula that provides them with daily lessons and practice. Students should spend a minimum of 60 minutes each day. Juniors and Seniors who are interested in school-to-work credit, should contact the Odyssey Administrator to set up a program. Music lessons and other lessons can be paid for through discretionary funds each semester. These fees would be paid directly to the provider.

Seniors and some second semester junior students, who are in good standing and who have completed their high school graduation requirements, may wish to look at post-secondary course options at technical schools or colleges that are not offered through Odyssey Academy for dual credit. These options are listed in the Student/Parent Handbook.

## WEN Courses

Students who take WEN courses do not need to place orders for the classes or the materials, but should consider that the majority of the class is online and self-contained.

## All Other Courses

For all other courses, learning project plans or outlines must be submitted prior to orders being approved by their teacher of record. Any materials you select must relate to the projects you plan/submit.

We recommend that you contact your post-secondary school(s) of choice directly to ensure you have met the academic requirements for admission and scholarship consideration. This is to inform you of Ripon's Graduation Requirements. Please know different course titles might be used through Odyssey Academy (though very similar).
