Conduct at Extra-curricular Events: Students are expected to exhibit good sportsmanship at both home and away events. Good sportsmanship means finding ways to support and encourage your team in positive ways, while treating other observers, the officials and opposing team/coaches with respect. Therefore things like fighting, booing, heckling, derogatory signs/symbols/chants and cheering/etc., throwing or dropping items (or refuse), or possession/use of tobacco products, controlled substances and/or alcoholic beverages (regardless of the site) are unacceptable. Noncompliance with the letter or spirit of this provision may be grounds for ejection from that and other events. Noncompliance may also lead to disciplinary action under the RHS Discipline and Conduct guidelines and/or the Extra-curricular Code.

Extra-curricular Code: The Board of Education has approved an extra-curricular code which covers students participating in all extra-curricular activities. The Assistant Principal/Athletic Director will review the code at 9th grade orientation. Any new students should watch a power point on the code. Before participation can begin **an extra-curricular code agreement must be signed by students and parents/guardians.**
