Students registered for fall classes, state testing began, kindergarten and preschool registration started, the open enrollment window opened and we hired our first position for 2017-18, a school psychologist. School Board

Elections on April 4

Voters in the Ripon Area School District will choose three school board members at the spring election on April 4. Each year three school board seats are on the ballot for new three-year terms. The nine-member Ripon Board of Education is elected at-large from the entire school district.

This year's ballot for the three seats that are open will include two incumbents, Sherry Muskavitch and Tom Stellmacher along with recently appointed board member, Amy Pollesch. The ballot is being rounded out with three challengers, Jen Dudzinski, Kim Mack and Josh Reider.



Open Enrollment

The Ripon Area School District began accepting Open Enrollment applications for the 2017-18 school year on February 6, 2017. Any Wisconsin parents/guardians who are not Ripon Area School District residents but want their child(ren) to attend public schools in Ripon in 2017-18 may apply for enrollment acceptance.

In accordance with state law, applications may only be submitted beginning February 6, 2017 at 8:00 a.m. through April 28, 2017 at 4:00 p.m. and must be on site at the Ripon Administrative Services Center, 1120 Metomen Street in Ripon by that deadline date and time. Postmark dates will not satisfy the deadline for application submission requirements as state regulations require that mailed applications not on site by April 28, 2017 cannot be accepted and will be returned to the sender. The Department of Public Instruction is accepting Open Enrollment applications online during the specified timeframe at <http://oe.dpi.wi.gov>. Online applications are encouraged and recommended.

Additional Facility Improvements

The Ripon Area School Board approved additional work at its February meeting. The work included doors at Barlow Park, middle and high school courtyard window replacement, a purge fan for the STEM wing, renovations for a classroom, middle school classroom furniture, lights and bleachers for the tennis courts, a pool lobby, and improvement to the south athletic field. More work is expected to be approved at the March meeting.

Throughout the project there were phases that presented significant budget risks such as setting footings, opening existing structures and demolishing the old middle school. With those items complete, it is safe to bring back items initially put on hold.

Two years ago in February 2015, the Board approved a resolution to borrow \$900,000 and use \$1,000,000 of district fund balance for an additional 21,000 square feet of space including the STEM (science, technology, engineering and math) spaces; agriculture room; a MS/HS music suite; high school commons, the middle school academic areas, and the new high school gymnasium beyond the scope of the \$29.1 million referendum approved in November 2014. Due to the project being under budget, that loan will be paid back in July 2017.

In addition to completing the final projects and paying back the loan, the use of a \$1,000,000 of district fund balance for this one-time capital project positively impacted state aid and reduced the property tax levy in 2016. This use of fund balance for the project is expected to reduce the property tax levy in 2017 too.

Ripon Area School District Welcomes New Board Member

At a special meeting on February 16, 2017, the Ripon Area School Board appointed Amy Pollesch to fill the vacant one-year position created when Dan Zimmerman resigned from the Board on February 2, 2017. Mrs. Pollesch was appointed by the Board by a majority vote after being publicly interviewed. Josh Rieder, Kate Williams, Nicole Kutz-Menard, and Gary Wetzel also interviewed for the one-year position.

Mrs. Pollesch will serve until April 2018, the date Zimmerman’s three-year term on the board is set to expire. While Mrs. Pollesch will assume the responsibilities of this term immediately, she is still in the race for one of the three-year term positions and is still eligible to be voted into the longer term through the election process.

If Mrs. Pollesch were to be elected to the School Board in April for a three-year term, she would need to resign from the one-year position and then the one-year position would become open again.

“The Ripon Area School District is fortunate to have a history of dedicated individuals serving on the Board. Much has been accomplished with improving facilities, balancing budgets, hiring administrators and implementing a continuous improvement process,” Superintendent Dr. Whitrock shared. “The Board also recently approved guidelines for strengthening the conversation and collaboration between charter and legacy schools. Mrs. Pollesch has knowledge of the schools and extensive community connections. This will be very valuable as the district looks to address mental health issues and poverty within our school system. A strong public school system is dependent on community involvement and support. The high interest from the community with regards to the school board is a very good thing.”

2017 isn’t just another year, it’s an opportunity to ensure that the students in the Ripon Area School District are academically prepared for their futures. As we welcome in 2017, we look forward to the endless possibilities that await our students in the year to come.

Our goal is to ensure that all students in the Ripon Area School District will have a plan to be college and career ready. To achieve our goal, we have established an academic and career planning (ACP) process that will assist students in creating and cultivating their visions for post-secondary success through self-exploration, career

exploration, and the development of career management and planning skills.

Prior to winter break, middle and high school students received accounts to Career Cruising, the management system that provides the structure and information to lead students in their academic and career plan. Within this system, students completed a matchmaker assessment to help them learn more about their interests, skills, preferences and aspirations and identify careers that may be of interest to them. Students may access Career Cruising anytime to conduct career research and search for schools and careers of interest.

As we launch into 2017, high school students will select their courses for the upcoming 2017-18 school year. Our district has developed an Academic and Career Planning Guide that will be used to help students schedule their courses. This extensive guide helps students explore

their numerous academic and career options throughout high school and beyond. This guide also highlights the many opportunities students have to take college courses while still in high school, which can be a great financial benefit to families as they plan for their child’s future. Planning guides are available for students to guide them through their course selection process. We are excited to be able to offer a wide variety of courses that align with the students’ interests and prepare them for their journey beyond high school.

Our ACP process will ensure that all students have the opportunity to personalized learning through activities and experiences to connect academic courses and personal, social and career goals. We celebrate the many new opportunities that await the students of the Ripon Area School District and the plan that we have in place to support them in 2017 and beyond.

Ripon Area School District Presents “If I Could Have a Do-Over”

The Ripon Area School District invited parents, guardians and community members to attend “If I Could Have a Do-Over” on Wednesday, February 15 at 6:00 p.m. in the Ripon High School Auditorium. The free program was presented by Mr. John Halligan and was part of the District’s on-going efforts to support students and their families in identifying students in crisis, share coping strategies, and bullying prevention.

Mr. Halligan lost his son, Ryan, to suicide on October 7, 2003, at the age of 13. The presentation was described by Mr. Halligan as “a father’s hard-earned lessons about cyberbullying, depression, and suicide in which I step the audience through the lessons learned from our tragedy.” He addressed the latest bullying challenges that youth face through social media and provided parents with recommendations on how adolescents can interact with their peers in person and online.

In memory of his son and just a few months after Ryan’s death, Mr. Halligan spearheaded the Vermont Bullying Prevention Law in 2004. He also led the passing of law in 2006 requiring suicide prevention education in public schools. He was outspoken about the need for more awareness and prevention of bullying, cyberbullying and teen suicide throughout the United States, Canada, and Latin America. He and his wife Kelly have appeared on several national TV Programs including Primetime with Diane Sawyer, PBS Frontline, and Oprah.

The Ripon Area School District partnered with members of Ripon Medical Center’s Behavior Health Services team to be onsite at the presentation to provide immediate educational information and answer questions about therapy services available in our community. Superintendent Dr. Mary Whitrock shared, “Mr. Halligan’s message about Ryan’s journey is so very critical for us to know about and understand as it underscores the urgency for schools to have a comprehensive bullying prevention program that includes addressing adolescent mental health and the development of coping skills when it comes to facing bullying, especially on-line. Mr. Halligan’s presentation highlighted how essential it is to empower students to shift from bystanders to upstanders to respond.”

Students Present Project Lead the Way



Throughout the district, students in grades K-12 find themselves more actively engaged in science, technology and engineering through Project Lead the Way (PLTW). This program empowers students to adopt a design-thinking mindset through compelling activities, projects, and problems that build upon each other and relate to the world around them. A group of Ripon students demonstrated the robots that they built through PLTW at the State School Board Convention in Milwaukee on January 19. Mrs. Janet Ernst, a 5th Grade Teacher at Quest Elementary and a leader in PLTW accompanied the students and assisted them in their presentations.

In PLTW students are engaged in hands-on activities in computer science, engineering, and biomedical science, they become creative, collaborative problem solvers ready to take on any challenge. Students are immersed in design as they investigate engineering and tech topics and have opportunities to learn about a variety of disciplines within those fields before beginning post-secondary education or careers. Project Lead the Way provides opportunities to develop highly transferable skills in collaboration, communication and critical thinking, which are relevant for any coursework or career.

Catalyst Project Showcase Night & Gallery Walk

Catalyst Charter Middle School held its winter Project Showcase Night and Gallery Walk on February 9. The driving question was how do organisms play unique and important roles in their environment? After receiving a request from a movie studio, students worked to create a model of a unique organism and design its environment that will star in their next big sci-fi movie.
