Feeding America Notes

Fall 2017

Board needs to want to do it because it is a lot of work.

Families fed in the past – 400-500 families

Approximately 15000 lbs of food give out

(Cereal light vs meat heavy)

Past Feeding America's-Fall and Spring of 2014 and 2015

Spring is smaller than the fall feedings

Amy calls Feeding America with date and time and # of families, food is based on their inventory at the time. Usually send canned items (soup, vegetables), snack (crackers, chips), breakfast (oatmeal, cereal), breakfast bar, juice item, bread, meat. Meat 2-5 frozen items/family. Fresh produce (apples, potatoes) we will need to break down into ex: 6 apples/family because usually come in big bags. (15 lb bag x 30 bags)

Diverse Options has a variety of activities and opportunities to teach the Catalyst students. An Example given: what it takes to go to work; the skills necessary. Diverse Options has staff resources to put different things together depending upon what Catalyst teachers and/or students want to learn. Can continue to build on these different learning topics; topics are unlimited. Start with 1 time a month and see if it can progress to more times a month.
