Re: Parent Satisfaction Survey

The purpose of this document is to report on the recent parent satisfaction survey conducted by the Donovan Group for the Ripon Area School District. This report provides an overview of the methodology used before outlining a summary of the results and a detailed review of the data.

## **OVERVIEW OF METHODOLOGY**

The 2021 version of the Ripon Area School District's Parent Satisfaction Survey is a continuation of a research project developed and first implemented as an online survey in 2017. The purpose of the survey is to elicit responses from parents regarding their perceptions of four factors identified as important performance indicators: (1) the school and learning environment, (2) the relationship between the teacher and child, (3) the principal's leadership and relationships, and (4) the district and superintendent.

The survey comprises 21 questions, each scored on a 5-point Likert scale. The survey allows respondents to participate anonymously. All respondents are provided an opportunity to offer comments at the end of the survey for purposes of clarification and to offer more specific insight and direction.

In addition, the survey included three questions related to the 2022-23 school calendar to find out if parents preferred early release or full days off for staff in-service days and also if they had a preference when those days took place.

Data analysis was conducted by the Donovan Group, an independent third party, using accepted practice for quantitative analysis, as used in previous surveys.

## **GENERAL SUMMARY WITH YEAR COMPARISONS**

The Parent Satisfaction Survey was initiated on December 8, 2021, and was available to parents through December 14, 2021. At the close of the data collection period, 368 respondents participated in the survey (an increase from 321 participants in 2020). Each of the respondents identified with at least one school (i.e., having a child in at least one school) within the district.

The table that follows includes an average, based on all the data that was collected in the 2021 survey, for each of the questions asked. These averages are compared with those from the

2017, 2019 and 2020 surveys. The column on the far right shows a difference between the 2020 and 2021 averages.

A review of the data suggests that while the number of survey completions is higher this year than in the past (from 211 in 2017, 262 in 2019, 321 in 2020 to 368 in 2021), the averages per question are also higher than in the first two years the survey was offered. Twenty of the 21 questions had lower averages than in 2020, although seven were less than 0.10 different than a year ago and only four responses were lower than 0.20.

While each question differs, the compelling story from this data is that the vast majority of participants agree or strongly agree with every statement and-or question. It is also not lost on us that the 2021 survey was again conducted during a global pandemic, when satisfaction among parents — as evidenced by surveys in other districts where we have conducted similar surveys — is down markedly. Therefore, we find the 2021 data, along with the results from 2020, especially positive and compelling.

## RESULTS BY CATEGORY PER LEVEL

Next, we would like to provide a breakdown of the 2021 data by grade levels and by question categories.

The levels, which are shown by columns, include the following:

- 1) Barlow Park, Barlow Charter and Journey Charter (grades Early Childhood through 2)
- 2) Murray Park and Quest Charter (grades 3-5)
- 3) Ripon Middle School and Catalyst Charter (grades 6-8)
- 4) Ripon High School (grades 9-12)
- 5) Odyssey Virtual Charter (grades preschool through 12)

The question categories, as noted above, include:

- 1) School and Learning Environment
- 2) Relationship Between the Teacher and Child
- 3) Principal's Leadership and Relationships
- 4) District/Superintendent

Each of the categories is detailed in turn.

## **School and Learning Environment**

Seven questions contribute to the overall parent perception score of their child's School and Learning Environment. The following table outlines this data by school level:

Satisfaction among parents whose children attend Odyssey Virtual Charter were higher in six of the seven statements. Ripon Middle School and Catalyst Charter saw increases in two of the seven statements, while Barlow Park, Barlow Charter and Journey Charter saw an increase in the statement related to classroom supplies.

Averages at all of the levels were still very high although lower than in 2020. It is interesting to note that the lowest score among the statements at every level other than Odyssey Virtual Charter related to receiving regular feedback from staff.

# Relationship Between the Teacher and Child

Seven questions contribute to the overall parent perception score of the Relationship Between the Teacher and Child. The following table outlines the averages by school level:

For this set of questions, the averages, across the board, remain quite high although other than Odyssey Virtual Charter the average dropped from 2020 at all other levels. Odyssey saw increases in each of the seven areas, while Murray Park and Quest Charter made gains in the areas related to recognizing good work and behavior and positive phone calls and notes.

Once again, the question about feedback, specifically *I receive positive phone calls or notes about my child from school*, still receives the lowest scores among this set of questions and has still provides the greatest opportunity for staff to impact parent's overall satisfaction. Efforts in this area should continue.

## **Principal's Leadership and Relationships**

Four questions contribute to the overall parent perception score associated with the Principal's Leadership and Relationship. The following table outlines the averages by school level:

For this set of questions, the averages are still quite high and remain above the averages from 2019, although there was a slight drop from 2020, except at Odyssey Virtual Charter. Principal efforts in terms of being responsive and informative continue to pay off in terms of increased parents satisfaction and should be continued.

## The District/Superintendent

The following table outlines the District/Superintendent averages by school level.

The averages were similar for Barlow Park, Ripon Middle School and Ripon High School. It is interesting to note that the average at Murray Park was approximately 0.40 points higher than at the previous three schools. The highest average for the three statements was by parents of students at Odyssey Virtual Charter, which makes sense considering the strong scores that school received in the previous sections. While the scores remain quite high, efforts at continued communication with a clear message will help maintain and perhaps increase the scores in 2022.

## 2022-23 CALENDAR RESULTS

This year's survey also included three questions about next year's proposed calendar, noting the proposed 2022-23 calendar is very similar to the 2021-22 school year calendar. The School Board wanted feedback from parents before making its decision.

## **CORRELATIONS**

In an effort to find the questions that were most positively correlated with high levels of overall satisfaction, a Person Coefficient calculation was conducted as the final analysis in this report. Specifically, correlation was calculated for each of the questions and their relationship to the total levels of satisfaction based on a sum of all the responses.

Using this calculation, the numbers will fall between -1 and +1, with a perfect positive correlation between the two variables as +1 and a perfect negative correlation as -1. If no correlation exists between the numbers, the correlation would be zero or near zero.

As would be expected, especially considering that the individual responses for each question were baked into the total satisfaction number, correlation for each item was very high and ranged from "I would recommend this school to other parents" (r=0.86) to "I regularly receive feedback from school staff on how well my child is learning" (r=0.65).
