Two New Principals Start July 1, 2024



St. Wenceslaus Street Improvements

A high priority project to be completed this school year includes repairs to St. Wenceslaus Street from Fond du Lac Street to East Sullivan Street. The goal of the project is to improve safety and aesthetics to this community space. In addition to the new two-way street and the infrastructure under the street completed by the City of Ripon, specific improvements include adding sidewalks, a grass verge between the street and sidewalk, curbs, and gutters. Additionally, conduit may also be placed underground by Alliant Energy so power lines could be buried at a future date. The repairs will likely extend into the fall sports season so everyone's patience and flexibility will be much appreciated.





Expert Gives Parent Talk on Digital Safety

Education Foundation Buys Instruments

Murray Park Quest students play the Choirchimes thanks to a grant from the Ripon Education Foundation. The \$2,500 grant provided two sets of Choirchimes. All students, even those with special needs, benefit from playing the chimes. Music teacher Christina Muenchow explained, "The music skills that can be taught by ringing are numerous such as note duration, rhythm, harmony, melodic line, and music literacy. Students will increase their independent thinking, listening skills, attention span, physical coordination, self-discipline, and personal expression through ringing. They also gain positive social and emotional skills through collaboration and further their development of self-esteem. Working with a group of peers in ringing teaches tolerance, patience, support, and cooperation, to name a few."













Students Experience Solar Eclipse

Science classes were held outside on April 8 when Ripon students experienced the total solar eclipse. Donning protective eyewear, some classes charted the progress of the eclipse in journals while others listened to teachers explain the phenomenon of what they were experiencing firsthand. Fifty Ripon High School Science students traveled to Indiana for the once-ina-lifetime event with local support from the Ripon Education Foundation.











Academic All-State Honors



The Ripon High School Girls' received Basketball team recognition as a 2024 Academic All-State Team by the Wisconsin Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA). With a cumulative grade point average of 3.986, the team ranked at the top of their division and achieved the highest average in the entire state.

Regional Robotic Champs



Ripon's RHS Robotics Team was named Lake Superior Regional ended Champions. The team qualification rounds in 14th place out of 55 teams and earned first alternate going into the playoffs. After just one round the Tigers joined the top-ranked Alliance where they collaborated with their partner teams in the final challenges. After 4 playoff matches they earned the title of Regional Champions.
