

#### U.S. News & World Report Recognitions



Congratulations to Quest, Murray Park, and Ripon Middle School (RMS) for earning Best Schools distinctions from U.S. News & World Report. Quest and Murray Park ranked #42 and #138 respectively out of 951 Wisconsin elementary schools ranked in the state while RMS is ranked #271 out of 494 middle schools in the state. U.S. News analyzed 103,099 Pre-K, elementary, and middle schools to determine rankings in each state and recognizes that great elementary and middle schools educate their students from all socioeconomic backgrounds to set them up for success. RMS Principal Rick Bunge commented, "We are always looking to grow and improve. It is nice for students and staff to be recognized for their hard work." " Principal Renee Bunge offered praise for students and staff sharing, "Our Murray Park/Quest students and staff work incredibly hard to continue to learn and grow. We are very proud of them for their continued hard work, perseverance, and progress." This marks the second year in a row that all three schools received this national distinction.

## One Primary School for 2024-2025

During the fall semester, the staff and governance councils of Barlow Park and Journey engaged in conversations about creating one 4K-2nd grade elementary school in Ripon. Journey opened in 2013 as a K-2 Project-Based Learning (PBL) charter school using inquiry-based approaches. Learners are taught basic knowledge to tackle realistic problems typically in the areas of science and social studies, often integrating literacy and math. In 2020, Barlow opened as a K-2 competency-based and play-based charter school with literacy and math learners working in flexible groups with teachers based on each student's individual academic needs.

Since Journey opened, parents needed to choose between Barlow and Journey. Some parents have expressed concern their child may miss out on elements offered in the other school as well as students not always being able to interact with all of the children in their grade level. Uniting the schools would create one cohesive model of education for the early childhood through second grade students in the Ripon Area School District.



"Adding a district-wide school social worker was critical to meet the ever-changing needs of our school community. School social workers are skilled in bridging the gap between school, home, and community while providing critical support to our most vulnerable student and family populations," remarked Emmy Jess, Director of Pupil Services.



Carrie serves families in transitional living situations and students in foster care. She also supports students facing truancy, expulsion, and change of placement due to behavioral concerns.

#### Americorp Volunteers Build Reading Skills



**Elementary students are growing their literacy skills with the help of Reading Corps volunteers.** Ripon's full and part-time tutors work one-on-one with 64 kindergarten and first graders. Reading Corps has been recognized as one of the best practices in literacy promotion. Tutors provide 20-minute tutoring sessions, track student progress, and meet with reading coaches regularly to assess data and work toward learning targets. The program, through donations to the organization, pays tutors a stipend but does not charge the school district for this service. ### Mid Year Budget Update

The Ripon community's ongoing investment in its students prepares them to perform at the highest level. Through December, revenues of \$5.8 million equaled 24% of projections for the school year. Last year, revenues equaled 26% at this point. Like last year, District program expenses equaled 36% (\$8.7 million) projected year-end budget of amounts. In July, the District began utilizing federal ESSER III funds and will spend down all of this grant by September 2024. Planning has begun for balancing next year's budget.
