

Definition: a controlled release of students from a school or another location safely to their parent

What should parents do?



Why Stay Home?

- Helps keep your children safe
- Allows emergency personnel to:
 - Focus on student safety
 - Manage the crisis
 - Handle the emergency situation



How To Stay Informed?

- 1. Monitor district website, district social media, and local media
- 2. Your child may send you a text
- 3. Do not call or text your child
- 4. Do not call the school
- 5. Keep your phone charge




Ways To Stay Informed?

- Accurate Information Takes Time to Verify and Share
- Methods to Communicate
 - Messenger through IC
 - Text message
 - Email
 - District website
 - Local news media




How To Be Ready?

- 1. Bring photo id
- 2. Be patient and stay calm
- 3. Send one adult
- 4. Bring pen or pencil



How To Be Ready?

- 5. Send your child's emergency contact as listed in IC if you can't go to reunification site
- 6. Notify district if child self-evacuates and goes home
- 7. Watch for specific number to call to let the school know child is safe
